## Finished Measurements

Approx, before edging $40 \times 50 \mathrm{in} / 102 \times 127.5 \mathrm{~cm}$.

## Materials

- $4 \times 50 \mathrm{~g}$ skeins of Noro Silk Garden in \#84.
- $2 \times 50 \mathrm{~g}$ skeins of Noro Silk Garden in \#205.
- $2 \times 50 \mathrm{~g}$ skeins of Noro Silk Garden in \#208.
- $1 \times 50 \mathrm{~g}$ skein of Noro Silk Garden in \#47.
- $1 \times 50 \mathrm{~g}$ skein of Noro Silk Garden in \#203.
- $3 \times 50 \mathrm{~g}$ skeins of Noro Silk Garden Solo in \#0 1
- $1 \times 50 \mathrm{~g}$ skeins of Noro Silk Garden Solo in \#03.
- $1 \times 50 \mathrm{~g}$ skeins of Noro Silk Garden Solo in \#07.
- $1 \times 50 \mathrm{~g}$ skeins of Noro Silk Garden Solo in \# 11
- $1 \times 50 \mathrm{~g}$ skeins of Noro Silk Garden Solo in \#33.
- $1 \times 50 \mathrm{~g}$ skeins of Noro Silk Garden Solo in \#35.
- $1 \times 50 \mathrm{~g}$ skeins of Noro Silk Garden Solo in \#43.
- $1 \times 50 \mathrm{~g}$ skeins of Noro Silk Garden Solo in \#6 1 .
- One pair size US $8 / 5 \mathrm{~mm}$ needles, or size to obtain given gauge.
- Size US $7 / 4.5 \mathrm{~mm}$ circular knitting needle, $47 \mathrm{in} / 120 \mathrm{~cm}$ for edging.
- Tapestry needle.


## Gauge

16 sts and 24 rows $=4 \mathrm{in} / 10 \mathrm{~cm}$ over St st using size US 8/ 5 mm needles.

## Glossary

bind off To finish off an edge and keep stitches from unroveling by lifing the fists stitch over the second, the second over the third, etc. (UK: cast off).
bind off in ribbing Maintain the ib pattern as you bind off (knit the knit stitches; pul the purl stitches) (UK: cost off in ribbing)
cast on Form a foundation row by making specified number of loops on the kniting needle. decrease Reduce the number of stitches in a row (i.e., knit 2 together, pul 2 together). increase Add to the number of stitches in a row (i.e., knit in foont and back of sitch).
knitwise Insert the needle into the stitch as if you were going to knit it.
make one Insert tip of $L H$ needle from front to back under the strand between the lass stitch worked and the next sitich on the needle. Knit into the back loop to increase one sitch.
make one purl stitch With the needle tip, lift the strand between the lost stitch worked and the next stitch on lefthhand needle and purl it. One purl stitch has been added.
no stitch Onsome charts, "nosititch" isindicated withshoded spaceswheresticheshave beendecreased or not yet made. In such casses, work the stitches of the chart, skipping over the "no stith"" spaces. place markers Loop a piece of contrassing yarm or a purchased stitch marker onto the needle. pick up and knit/purl Knit (or purl) into the loops along an edge.
purlwise Insert the needle into the stitch as if you were going to pul it.
selvage stitch Edge sitith that helps make seaming essier.
skip Skip specified number of stiches of the previous row ond work into next stitch (UK: miss).
slip, slip, knit/purl Slip next two sts knitwise (purlwise), one ot a time, to righthand needle. Insert tip of leff-hand needle into fornts of these sts from left to inght and knit/purl them together to decreass one sitch.
slip stitch In kniting, pass a stitch from the leff-hand to the righthhand needle as ift o purl without working it. In crochet, insert hook through loop or edge, yarn over and pull through loop on hook (UK: ss or sc).
work even Continve in specified pattern without increasing or decreasing (UK: work striaght). yarn over In kititing, make a new stitch by placing the yarn over the ighthhand needle (UK: yfwd, yon, ynn). In crochet, wind yarn around hook. (UK: yoh or yhh).

## Notes

1. There are 20 blanket squares, each knitted separately and sewn together.
2. Each square is cast on with 42 sts using the long-tail method. The first row is purled. This row is not shown on chart.
3. Ten motif squares are worked Intarsia style, or a mix of in tarsia with stranded colorwork. These squares are worked in Stockinette stitch following the charts.
4. Ten plain squares are not patterned, and are worked in Stockinette stitch.
5. Before seaming, each square will measure approximately $10 \frac{1}{2} \times 10 \frac{1}{2}$ in $/ 26.5 \times 26.5 \mathrm{~cm}$. After seaming each square will be approximately $10 \times 10 \mathrm{in} / 25.5 \times 25.5 \mathrm{~cm}$.
6. Each square is 42 sts wide and approximately 62 rows long. This does not include cast on and bind off rows, or the purl row affer the cast on row.
7. Depending on the pattern stitch and yarn irregularities, you may reach the length of $10 \frac{1}{2}$ in $/ 26.5 \mathrm{~cm}$ before you reach 62 rows. If you need extra rows, use the last color to complete the square.

## Motif Squares

- All motif squares are worked in Stockinette Stitch Intarsia-style, or with stranded colorwork.
- Read odd-numbered, right-side rows from right to left.
- Read even-numbered, wrong-side rows from left to right.
- Duetothevariation of colors inSilk Gardenyarns, the background colors may be a liftle different from what is shown the photo. You can chose the desired section of color.


## Square 1-Pagoda

With color \#07, cast on 42 sts and purl 1 row on WS.
Work rows 1-61 of Pagoda chart.
With color \#208, bind off purlwise on WS.

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## Square 2 - Teapot and cups

With color \#01, cast on 42 sts and purl 1 row on WS.
Work rows 1-62 of Teapot and Cups chart. With color \#208, bind off purlwise on WS.
With color \# 11 embroider lid of teapot using duplicate stitch.

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Square 3 - Koi
Additional materials

- Scraps of black or charcoal (for mouth and eyes).

With color \#03, cast on 42 sts and purl 1 row on WS.
Work rows 1-62 of Koi chart.
With color \#43, bind off knitwise on RS.



## Square 4 - Bonsai Tree

With color \#35, cast on 42 sts and purl
1 row on WS.
Work rows 1-61 of Bonsai Tree chart.
With color \#35, bind of $f$ purlwise on WS.

## Square 5 - Cherry Blossoms

With color \#1, cast on 42 sts and purl 1 row on WS.
Work rows 1-61 of Cherry Blossoms chart.
With color \#1, bind off purlwise on WS.

## Square 6-Ocean Waves

Note: In this pattern stitch, you may not need 62 rows to reach your measurement of $101 / 2 \mathrm{in} / 26.5 \mathrm{~cm}$.

With color \#O1, cast on 42 sts and purl 1 row on WS.
Work rows 1-54 of Ocean Waves chart, or until piece measures $10 \frac{1}{2} \mathrm{in} / 26.5 \mathrm{~cm}$ from beg.
With color \#208, bind off.

## Square 7 - Tori Gate

With color \#61, cast on 42 sts and purl 1 row on WS.
Work rows 1-62 of Tori Gate chart, or until piece measures $101 / 2 \mathrm{in} / 26.5 \mathrm{~cm}$ from beg.
With color \#203 bind off knitwise on RS.


## Square 8 - Mount Fuji

With color \#07 (lower background and shapes), cast on 42 sts and purl 1 row on WS. Work rows 1-62 of Mount Fuii chart, or until piece measures $10 \frac{1}{2} \mathrm{in} / 26.5 \mathrm{~cm}$ from beg.
With color \#O1 bind off knitwise on RS.

## Optional

Outline the mountain peak with duplicate stitch using the lightest strand of color in Silk Garden Solo \#O 1, to accentuate it from the background.


## Square 9 - Flying Crane

With color \#61, cast on 42 sts and purl 1 row on WS
Work rows 1-62 of Flying Crane chart, or until piece measures
$101 / 2 \mathrm{in} / 26.5 \mathrm{~cm}$ from beg.
With color \#84 bind off knitwise on RS.

With color \#01, cast on 42 sts and purl 1 row on WS.
Work rows 1-61 of Fan chart.
With color \#O1, bind off purlwise on WS.

## Finishing

Block squares to measurements. Sew squares together following the placement diagram or as desired.

## Border \#1

With RS facing, beginning at the top left corner of the afghan, pick up and $k$ sts evenly along first long side of piece (approx 2 sts for every 3 rows).
Knit 9 rows. Bind off knitwise on RS.

## Border \#2

With RS facing, beginning at bottom right corner of the afghan, pick up sts and work same as for Border \#1.
Bind off.

## Border \#3

With RS facing, beginning at the lower left corner of the blanket, pick up and k 5 sts along side edge of Border \#1, pick up and
k 1 st in each cast-on st along lower edge, then 5 sts along side edge of Border \#2.
Knit 9 rows. Bind off knitwise on RS.

## Border \#4

With RS facing, beginning at top right corner of the afghan, pick up and $k 5$ sts along side edge of Border \#2, pick up and $k 1$ st in each bound-off st along top edge, then 5 sts along side edge of Border \#1.
Knit 9 rows. Bind off knitwise on RS.
Weave in all ends with tapestry needle.
