KAKADUWINE COUNTRY BERET

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materials

- 100g of Queensland Collection Kakadu shade #02 Amethyst.
- 50g of Mirasol **Nuna** shade #1045 Key Lime.
- US 7/4.5mm 16in circular needles and US 9/5.5mm 16in circular needles and double-pointed needles.
- I stitch marker for end of round.

gauge

18 sts per 4in/10cm in ribbing. 16 sts per 4in/10cm in cable pattern. Adjust needle size to obtain proper gauge.

This is a cute and flirty beret with enough interest to keep you knitting straight on through the night. It can be worn slouchy in the back or pulled to the side for an asymmetrical effect. The little cable pattern worked throughout makes a terrific texture and an engaging knit. It is easy to work without a cable needle or any additional tools and the repeat is easy to remember and complete on the go. Grab a project bag and carry this little cutie with you in your purse.

stitches used

RTC (Right Twist Cable) Worked over the next two sts; K in back of second st without removing, k first st, remove both sts from needle.

instructions

CAST ON

Loosely cast on 81 sts, PM, join to work in the round on first row.

RIBBING

Round I: (k2, p1) repeat around.

Repeat row I for 2in.

INCREASE AND BODY

Switch to US9/5.5mm needle.

Round 2: (kl,kfb, pl) repeat around. 108 sts.

Round 3: (k2, p2) repeat around.

Round 4: (k2, p2) repeat around.

Round 5: (RTC right twist cable, p2) repeat around.

Round 6: (k2, p2) repeat around.

Round 7: (k2, p2) repeat around.

Round 8: (k2, p2) repeat around.

Repeat Rounds 5-8 for approximately 5ins.

DECREASING TOP OF HAT

Round 9: (RTC right twist cable, p2) repeat around.

Move end of round marker over one stitch to the right, so it falls between the last two purls.

Round 10: (p, k2,p, k2tog, ssk, p, k2,p) repeat around.

Round II: (p, k2, p, k2, p, K2, p) repeat around.

Round 12: (p, k2, k2tog, ssk, k2, p) repeat around.


Round 13: (p, RTC, RTC, RTC, p) repeat around.





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Round 14: (p, k, k2tog, ssk, k, p) repeat around.

Round 15: (p, k4, p) repeat around.

Round 16: (p, k2tog, ssk, p) repeat around.

Round 17: (p, RTC, p) repeat around.

Round 18: (k2tog, ssk) repeat around.


Round 19: Knit around.

Round 20: K2tog around.

FINISHING

Cut yarn and thread darning needle. Thread through all remaining stitches, back through first two stitches and down through the center to inside of hat. Weave tail into inside of hat. Weave in all tails securely. Soak hat in sink with cool water and block on plate to shape hat. Q
