# 15 Chevron Jacket

●●●○ INTERMEDIATE



## Sizes

Sized for Small/Medium (Large) and shown in size Small/Medium.

## Finished Measurements

- Back armhole to armhole 20 (22)in/51 (56) cm.
- Length 29 (30½)in/73.5 (77.5)cm.

## Materials

- 4 x 100g skeins of Noro *Silk Garden* in #211 (A).
- 3 hanks in #395 (B).
- One size US 10 (6mm) circular needle, 32in/80cm long, OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE.
- One size US 11 (8mm) circular needle, 32in/80cm long, OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE.
- Size US G/6 (4mm) crochet hook.
- Stitch markers.

## Gauge

- For size Small/Medium: 14½ sts and 21 rows to 4in/10cm over chevron pattern using size US 10 (6mm) needle.
- For size Large: 13 sts and 17 rows to 4in/10cm over chevron pattern using size US 11 (8mm) needle.

## Knitting Abbreviations

## Crochet Abbreviations

**BP** back post; **BPdc** back post double crochet; **BPsc** back post single crochet; **BPtr** back post treble crochet; **ch** chain(s); **ch-** refers to chain or space previously made (i.e., ch-1 space); **ch-sp** chain space previously made; **dc** double crochet (UK: tr=treble); **dc2tog** double crochet 2 stitches together; **dtr** double treble (UK: trtr=triple treble); **FP** front post; **FPdc** front post double crochet; **FPsc** front post single crochet; **FPtr** front post treble crochet; **grp(s)** group(s); **hdc** half double crochet (UK: htr=half treble); **lp(s)** loop(s); **sc** single crochet (UK: dc=double crochet); **sc2tog** single crochet 2 stitches together; **sk** skip(ped); **sl st** slip stitch (UK: sc=single crochet); **sp(s)** space(s); **t-ch** turning chain; **tr** treble (UK: dtr=double treble); **trtr** triple treble (UK: qtr=quadruple treble).

## Glossary

**bind off** To finish off an edge and keep stitches from unraveling by lifting the first stitch over the second, the second over the third, etc. (UK: cast off).

**bind off in ribbing** Maintain the rib pattern as you bind off (knit the knit stitches; purl the purl stitches) (UK: cast off in ribbing)

**cast on** Form a foundation row by making specified number of loops on the knitting needle.

**decrease** Reduce the number of stitches in a row (i.e., knit 2 together; purl 2 together).

**increase** Add to the number of stitches in a row (i.e., knit in front and back of stitch).

**knitwise** Insert the needle into the stitch as if you were going to knit it.

**make one** Insert tip of LH needle from front to back under the strand between the last stitch worked and the next stitch on the needle. Knit into the back loop to increase one stitch.

**make one purl stitch** With the needle tip, lift the strand between the last stitch worked and the next stitch on left-hand needle and purl it. One purl stitch has been added.

**no stitch** On some charts, "no stitch" is indicated with shaded spaces where stitches have been decreased or not yet made. In such cases, work the stitches of the chart, skipping over the "no stitch" spaces.

**place markers** Loop a piece of contrasting yarn or a purchased stitch marker onto the needle.

**pick up and knit/purl** Knit (or purl) into the loops along an edge.

**purlwise** Insert the needle into the stitch as if you were going to purl it.

**selvage stitch** Edge stitch that helps make seaming easier.

**skip** Skip specified number of stitches of the previous row and work into next stitch (UK: miss).

**slip, slip, knit/purl** Slip next two sts knitwise (purlwise), one at a time, to right-hand needle. Insert tip of left-hand needle into fronts of these sts from left to right and knit/purl them together to decrease one stitch.

**slip stitch** In knitting, pass a stitch from the left-hand to the right-hand needle as if to purl without working it. In crochet, insert hook through loop or edge, yarn over and pull through loop on hook (UK: ss or sc).

**work even** Continue in specified pattern without increasing or decreasing (UK: work straight).

**yarn over** In knitting, make a new stitch by placing the yarn over the right-hand needle (UK: yfwd, yon, yrn). In crochet, wind yarn around hook. (UK: yoh or yrh).

## Notes

**1.** Jacket is sized using needle sizes. Small/Medium size is worked with size US 10 (6mm) needle, Large size is worked with size US 11 (8mm) needle. Fit is loose-fitting as fronts can be worn open.

**2.** \*Begin with A and work to end of skein, then switch to B and work to end of skein, repeat from \* to end.

**3.** Circular needle is used to accommodate large number of sts, do not join unless otherwise instructed.

## Jacket

With A, cast on 19 sts. Purl 1 row.

**Row 1 (RS)** K1, \*k1, yo; rep from \* to last 2 sts, k2—35 sts.

**Rows 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14 & 16** K1, p to last st, k1.

**Row 3** K1, \*k1, yo, k3, yo; rep from \* to last 2 sts, k2—51 sts.

**Row 5** K1, \*kfb, ssk, k2tog, kfb; rep from \* to last 2 sts, k2.

**Row 7** K1, \*kfb, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, kfb; rep from \* to last 2 sts, k2—67 sts.

**Row 9** K1, \*kfb, k1, ssk, k2tog, k1, kfb; rep from \* to last 2 sts, k2.

**Row 11** K1, \*kfb twice, ssk, k2tog, kfb twice; rep from \* to last 2 sts, k2—83 sts.

**Row 13** K1, \*kfb, k2, ssk, k2tog, k2, kfb; rep from \* to last 2 sts, k2.

**Row 15** K1, \*kfb twice, k1, ssk, k2tog, k1, kfb twice; rep from \* to last 2 sts, k2—99 sts.

**Row 17** K1, p to last st, k1.

# 15 Chevron Jacket



**Row 18** Knit.

**Row 19** K1, \*kfb, k3, ssk, k2tog, k3, kfb; rep from \* to last 2 sts, k2.

**Rows 20, 22, and 24** K1, p to last st, k1.

**Row 21** K1, \*kfb twice, k2, ssk, k2tog, k2, kfb twice; rep from \* to last 2 sts, k2—115 sts.

**Row 23** K1, \*kfb, k4, ssk, k2tog, k4, kfb; rep from \* to last 2 sts, k2.

**Row 25** K1, \*kfb twice, k3, ssk, pm, k2tog, k3, kfb twice; rep from \* to last 2 sts, k2—131 sts.

**Row 26** K1, p to last st, k1.

## Begin increase chevron pattern

**Row 27** K1, p to last st, k1.

**Row 28** Knit.

**Row 29 (even)** K1, \*kfb, k5, ssk, sl marker, k2tog, k5, kfb; rep from \* to last 2 sts, k2.

**Rows 30, 32 and 34** K1, p to last st, k1.

**Row 31 (inc)** K1, \*kfb twice, k4, ssk, sl marker, k2tog, k4, kfb twice; rep from \* to last 2 sts, k2—16 sts inc'd.

**Row 33 (even)** K1, \*kfb, k6, ssk, sl marker, k2tog, k6, kfb; rep from \* to last 2 sts, k2.

**Row 35 (inc)** K1, \*kfb twice, k5, ssk, sl marker, k2tog, k5, kfb twice; rep from \* to last 2 sts, k2—16 sts inc'd.

**Row 36** K1, p to last st, k1.

Rep rows 27–36 four times more, working 1 more knit st between kfb's and dec's every even row and inc row as before—291 sts. Work rows 27 and 28 once more.

## Divide for armhole

**Next row (RS)** K1, kfb, k15, ssk, k2tog, k15, kfb, bind off 71 sts leaving last loop on RH needle, [kfb, k15, ssk, k2tog, k15, kfb] twice, bind off 71 sts leave last loop on RH needle, kfb, k15, ssk, k2tog, k15, kfb, k2—149 sts.

**Next row** K1, [p to 1 st before bind off, purl last st tog with first st on other side of bind off] twice, p to last st, k1—147 sts.

## Begin straight chevron pattern

**Row 1 (RS)** K1, \*kfb, k15, ssk, sl marker, k2tog, k15, kfb; rep from \* to last 2 sts, k2.

**Row 2** K1, p to last st, k1.

**Rows 3–6** Rep rows 1 and 2 twice.

**Row 7** K1, p to last st, k1.

**Row 8** Knit.

**Rows 9 and 10** Rep rows 1 and 2.

Rep rows 1–10 once, then rep rows 1–6 once more.

Rep row 1 once more.

**Next row (WS)** Knit.

Rep last 2 rows once more. Bind off loosely.

## Front edging

With crochet hook and color of choice, beg at lower right front edge, work \*1 hdc, ch 1; rep from \* evenly along front and neck edges to lower left front edge.

## Finishing

Block lightly to measurements. ■
