Ribbon Summer Wrap

Description: This wrap is easy to make and a perfect addition to your “warmer weather” wardrobe. Knitting every row, the ribbon yarn makes a light-weight fabric, and the rows of the dropped-loop stitch breaks up the garter rows to add just enough visual interest and texture.

Sizes: O/S

Gauge: not critical

Materials:

- Yarn used in sample: Lirico (by Luisa Harding) 2 balls
- Yardage: 300 yds, worsted weight
- Needles: - 24” circular or straights. US Size 7
- Stitch marker (optional)

Abbreviations:

K = knit

Kfb = Knit one in front and in back (increase)

K2Tog = Knit 2 together (decrease)



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INCREASE PATTERN:

Rows 1 & 3: Knit to last stitch. Kfb. (1 st increase)

**Odd number rows will have the right side facing you. It may be helpful to put a stitch marker on this side to easily tell right from wrong side.*

Rows 2 & 4: Knit

Row 5: Knit, wrapping the yarn twice around the needle for each stitch. There will be two loops on the needle for each stitch.

Row 6. *Drop one of the loops in each stitch on the needle and K1 into the elongated loop.*
Repeat across the entire row.

Repeat rows 1-6 for pattern.

DECREASE PATTERN:

Rows 1 & 3: Knit to last 2 stitches. K2Tog (1 stitch decrease)

Rows 2 & 4: Knit

Row 5: Knit, wrapping the yarn twice around the needle for each stitch. There will be two loops on the needle for each stitch.

Row 6. *Drop one of the loops in each stitch on the needle and K1 into the elongated loop.*
Repeat across the entire row.

Repeat rows 1-6 for pattern.

WRAP:

Cast on 2 st.

Work increase pattern until there are 58 stitches (or until desired length) are on the needle. End on row 6.

Work decrease pattern until 2 stitches remain, ending on row 4
Loosely bind off all stitches.

FINISH:

Weave in ends. **Block lightly** if desired.
