



THE COLOR EVOLUTION



SILK SCARF WITH TASSEL

SKILL LEVEL: Easy

MATERIALS

Cash Silk Light by Laines Du Nord
2 balls x 25 grams in any color of your preference (col. 3052 shown)
Knitting Needles: size US6/4mm
Darning needle
Scissors
Measuring tape
Piece of cardboard

GAUGE

27 stitches x 33 rows = 4 x 4"/10 x 10cm over stockinette stitch using US6/4mm knitting needles.

STITCHES: Stocking stitch (RS knit, WS purl)

ABBREVIATIONS

st./sts. = stitch/stitches
Stockinette stitch (RS knit, WS purl)

FINISHED MEASUREMENT

Width 12in (30cm)
Length 53in (135cm) (without tassels)

NOTES

To make the two tassels, set aside about 5 grams of yarn before starting the scarf.

INSTRUCTIONS

Using US6/4mm needles cast on 80sts leaving a length of 50cm of yarn.

Work in stockinette stitch as follows:

Row 1 (RS): Knit to end.

Row 2: Purl to end.

Rep the last 2 rows until the 2 balls of yarn used leaving enough for the cast off row plus an extra 19½"/50cm.

Cast off.

Tassels: (make 2)

- Cut a piece of cardboard 20cm long to wrap the yarn around.
- Start by wrapping the yarn around the cardboard. Wrap it multiple times until you reach the desired thickness.
- After wrapping the yarn, cut it. Then cut another piece of yarn about 20 cm long and insert it under all the wraps, near the top edge of the cardboard. Tie a tight knot to secure the wrapped yarn, but don't remove it from the cardboard yet.
- Carefully slide the yarn off the cardboard. You will now have a bundle of yarn tied in the middle.
- Cut another piece of yarn about 20 cm long. Wrap it around the bundle of yarn about 2cm from the top to create the "head" of the tassel. Make a few turns and then tie a tight knot.

- cut the tassel on the opposite side to the head and Trim.

Thread the darning needle with the yarn at the cast off edge. Pass the needle through the cast off sts to form a gathered effect. Sew the tassel to the end of the gathered section. Repeat on the cast on edge of the scarf.
