## F L A S H

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SCARF

SCARF FLASH

MEASUREMENTS: approx. 78 3/4" (200 cm) in length $x 97 / 8^{\prime \prime}(25 \mathrm{~cm})$ in width, without fringe

MATERIALS
FLASH: 3 balls color 405

Knitting needles: size 13 (US) or 9 mm

## Stitches

Garter st, Stockinette st, fringe

## GAUGE

## Take time to check gauge

Using size 13 needles, in Stockinette st:
9 sts and 12 rows $=4 \times 4 "$

## INSTRUCTIONS

Cast on 36 sts. Work 4 rows in Garter st and continue in Stockinette st, maintaining 3 sts at either edge in Garter st.
When total length is $77 \frac{1}{2}$ " ( 197 cm ), continue to work 4 rows in Garter st and bind off (cast off) all sts.

## FINISHING (MAKING UP)

Fringe: Using the rem yarn, cut 54 strands of yarn, each $153 / 4^{\prime \prime}(40 \mathrm{~cm})$ in length.
Using 3 strands per fringe, insert 9 fringes to each end of scarf.

## HAT

## EN HAT FLASH

## MATERIALS

FLASH: 1 ball color 401

Circular knitting needles: size 13 (US) or 9
mm with an interchangeable cable, $153 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ (40 cm ) in length

## Stitches:

1x1 Ribbing in the round: 1st round: * K1, P1 * repeat from * to *.
2nd and following rounds: work same as the 1st round.
Stockinette st in the round: knit across
Magic loop (see explanation)
Pom-pom

Magic loop: Divide the stitches in half en slide each group of stitches onto each needle, without twisting them. The working yarn should be on the back needle. You will be working across the stitches on your front needle. Note: before working the stitches, slide the stitches from the back needle that you won't work onto the cable, remove the needle and start to work across the sts on the
front needle. After working these sts, insert the free needle into the unworked sts and slide the knitted sts from the back needle onto the cable as you did before. Now proceed to work the sts from the front needle. Repeat this technique of working in the round, removing the needle from the side where your working yarn is, until you finish the hat.

## GAUGE

## Take time to check gauge

Using size 13 needles, in Stockinette st:
9 sts and 14 rounds $=4 \times 4$ "

## INSTRUCTIONS

Cast on 50 sts. Work in $1 \times 1$ Ribbing in the round. Place a marker at the beginning of the round to keep track of the rounds. Once you have few stitches left, continue using the Magic loop technique.
When total length is $15 / 8^{\prime \prime}(4 \mathrm{~cm})$, continue to work Stockinette st in the round.
When total length is $51 / 2^{\prime \prime}(14 \mathrm{~cm})$, decrease every 2 rows, as follows:
1st round: 4 sts, 1 double decrease, * 7 sts, 1 double decrease * work from * to * a total of 5 times and finish with 3 sts $=40$ sts
Note: work the double decreases as follows: slip 2 sts tog, K1, and PSSO
3rd round: 3 sts, 1 double decrease, * 5 sts, 1
double decrease * work from * to * a total of 5 times and finish with 2 sts $=30$ sts
5th round: 2 sts, 1 double decrease, * 3 sts, 1 double decrease * work from * to * a total of 5 times and finish with 1 st = 20 sts
7th round: 1 st, 1 double decrease, * 1 st, 1 double decrease * work from * to * a total of 5 times $=10$ sts
Cut yarn leaving a long tail. Thread on a yarn needle and pull through all sts, gathering them tightly.

FINISHING (MAKING UP)
Pom-pom: cut a $43 / 4^{\prime \prime}(12 \mathrm{~cm})$ piece of cardboard and make a pom-pom.
Sew the pom-pom to the top of hat.
