



Size: UK 10 (14) - US 6 (10) - EU 36 (40)

Skill Level: intermediate

Note: figures in brackets () refer to larger size. Where only one figure is given this refers to both sizes.

How much yarn: 3 (4) balls (each ball 100g and 260m) of Avoriaz yarn (100% Fine Merino Wool, machine washable) shade no. 30521

Needles: A pair of 4.50mm knitting needles
A pair of 5.00mm knitting needles

A Dp (double-pointed) needle for cable

Sewing needle: Yarn needle with rounded point

Other items: Stitch-holders

STITCHES

Using needles: K1,P1 rib - STOCKING STITCH (ST ST): 1 row K (RS), 1 row P (WS) - REVERSE STOCKING STITCH (REV ST ST): 1 row P (RS), 1 row K (WS).

CENTRE LARGE CABLE: (worked on 21 sts)

Row 1 (RS): K21. **Row 2 and following even rows:** P21. **Row 3:** K21. **Row 5:** 14 Right Crossed stitches (= place next 7 sts onto Dp needle, on backside, K next 7 sts, K7 from Dp needle), K7. **Rows 7, 9 and 11:** K21. **Row 13:** K7, 14 Left Crossed stitches (= place next 7 sts onto Dp needle, on frontside, K next 7 sts, K7 from Dp needle). **Row 15:** K21. **Row 16:** P21. Rep Rows 1-16 throughout.

LEFT CABLE: (worked on 12 sts)

Row 1 (RS): K12. **Row 2 and following even rows:** P12. **Row 3:** K12. **Row 5:** 12 Left Crossed stitches (= place next 6 sts onto Dp needle, on frontside, K next 6 sts, K6 from Dp needle). **Rows 7 and 9:** K12.

Row 10: P12. Rep Rows 5-10 throughout.

RIGHT CABLE: (worked on 12 sts)

Row 1 (RS): K12. **Row 2 and following even rows:** P12. **Row 3:** K12. **Row 5:** 12 Right Crossed stitches (= place next 6 sts onto Dp needle, on backside, K next 6 sts, K6 from Dp needle). **Rows 7 and 9:** K12.

Row 10: P12. Rep Rows 5-10 throughout.

TENSIONS (after work has been steamed)

18 sts and 25 rows measure 10cm square over stocking stitch with 5.00mm needles.

Three Cable Motif (on 55 sts) is 18cm wide.

Take time to check tensions before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tensions to achieve success.

INSTRUCTIONS

Back: with 4.50mm needles cast on 70 (78) sts and, for lower border, work 9cm in K1,P1 rib. Change needles and, with 5.00mm needles cont to work in stocking st. When Back measures 35 (37)cm from beg, shape armholes: cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows, then dec 1 st, inside 2 sts, at each end on next and every following alternate row 5 (6) times. When armhole measures 17 (19)cm, cast off rem sts.

Front: with 4.50mm needles cast on 92 (100) sts and, for lower border, work 9cm in K1,P1 rib, increasing 3 sts evenly on last row across centre 18 sts. There are 95 (103) sts. Change needles and, with 5.00mm needles cont to work as follows: 19 (23) sts in st st, 3 sts in rev st st, 12 sts Left Cable, 3 sts in rev st st, 21 sts Centre Large Cable, 3 sts in rev st st, 12 sts Right Cable, 3 sts in rev st st, 19 (23) sts in st st. When Front measures 35 (37)cm from beg, shape armholes as Back and, at the same time of 4 cast-off sts on either side, dec 3 sts evenly on last row across centre 21 sts. When 4 armhole rows have been worked, shape V-neck: join another ball of yarn, divide work in half and continue separately on either side, dec on neck-edge 2 sts on next and every alternate row 11 (12) times, then 1 st every 4th row 3 times. Cast off rem 12 (13) sts on each shoulder at the same height as Back.

Sleeves: for each Sleeve, with 4.50mm needles cast on 34 (36) sts and, for cuff, work 4cm in K1,P1 rib. Change needles and, with 5.00mm needles, cont to work in stocking st, inc 1 st inside 2 sts at each end on 11th and every following 14th (12th) row 7 (9) times. There are 48 (54) sts. When Sleeve measures 42 (44)cm from beg, shape top: cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows, then dec 1 st, inside 4 sts, at each end on next and every following alternate row 7 times, then every following 4th row 4 times: 18 (24) sts remain. Then dec 1 st, inside 2 sts, at each end on next and every following alternate row 3 (5) times. When sleeve top measures 16 (18) sts, cast off remaining 12 (14) sts.

FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams. Set in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams. **Note:** wash jumper carefully at low temperature, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the jumper to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging them.
