

THE COLOR EVOLUTION



COLLAR

MATERIALS

Rozena by Laines du Nord: 3 x 25g balls (shown in 3102 Celery or 3206 Orange) Circular needles size US11/8mm with 24"/60cm cord. Stitch marker Large eye darning needle Scissors Tape measure

STITCHES USED

K2tbl, P2 rib

ABBREVIATIONS

RS = right side of work WS = wrong side of work SMb = stitch marker of the beginning of the round st /sts = stitch / stitches k = knit tbl = through back loop skpo = slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over rep. = repeat / repeating cont. = continue / continuing foll. = follow / following p = purl

Finished Measurements

22in/56cm x 14 in/35cm

TENSION

16sts by 18 rows = $4 \times 4^{\circ}/10 \times 10$ cm in stocking stitch using size US11/8mm knitting needles.

If tension square too small use larger needle, if too large use smaller needle. It is essential to work to the correct tension.

NOTES

Work the collar in K2 tbl, P2 in rounds. Work loosely without pulling tightly the yarn. The instructions for using size US11/8 mm needles are given specifically to knit the collar loosely.

INSTRUCTIONS

With US11/8mm needles cast on 89sts.

Pull the cord so that there are sts on the right-hand needle. (use the 89th st. to join the round by slipping the 89th st. from left to right needle, then pass first st. on right needle over slipped st., place the SMb. (88sts)

Round 1: * K2 tbl, P2, rep from * to end.

Rep this round until the 3 balls of yarn are used leaving enough for the cast off row.

Cast off by working skpo across the row.

Using the darning needle, sew in the ends on the WS.
