

# THE COLOR EVOLUTION



#### MATERIALS

Merino Yak by Laines du Nord 2 x 50g balls of col. 35 mustard or 09 tan Knitting needles size US7/4.5mm Large eye darning needle Scissors Tape measure

#### **ABBREVIATIONS**

RS = right side of work WS = wrong side of work st/sts = stitch/stitches k = knit rep = repeat / repeating r = row / rows p = purlpatt =pattern cont = continue / continuing foll = follow / following tbl = through the back loop inc 1 st. = knit into front and back of stitch. Dec 1 = K2tog

#### SKILL LEVEL: Easy

#### GAUGE

18 sts and 24 rows =  $4^{"}/10$  cm square over stocking stitch using size US7/4.5mm knitting needles.


#### FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Spine: 7½"/19cm Wingspan: 52"/132cm

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

Using size US7/4.5 mm knitting needles, cast-on 6 sts. Work patt as follows increasing 1 st at the beg of row 8 and on every foll 8th row 1st row (WS): knit to the last 3 sts, slip the last 3 sts p-wise with yarn in front. 2nd row: (RS): knit to the last 3 sts, slip the last 3 sts p-wise with yarn in front 3rd row: As row 1. 4th row: As row 2 5th row: As row 1. 6th row: As row 2. 7th row: As row 1. 8th row: K2, inc 1 st, knit to the last 3 sts, slip the last 3 sts p-wise with the yarn in front. Repeat rows 1 to row 8, until 37 sts in total on the needle. Work decreasing as follows: 1st row (WS): knit to the last 3 sts, slip the last 3 sts p-wise with the yarn in front. 2nd row (RS): knit to the last 3 sts. slip the last 3 sts p-wise with the yarn in front. 3rd row: As row 1. 4th row: As row 2 5th row: As row 1. 6th row: As row 2. 7th row: As row 1. 8th row: K3, K2tog, knit to the last 3 sts. slip the last 3 sts p-wise with the yarn in front. Repeat rows 1 to row 8 until 6 sts rem. Work 7 more rows in patt. Work cast off row as follows: Cast off first 3 sts knitwise, cast off last 3 sts purlwise. Sew in ends.










### Diagram 1: granny motif
