The legend of Tristan and Isolde takes place during the Middle Ages, when knighthood and the chivalric code prevailed. The tragic story is of the adulterous love between the Cornish knight Tristan and the Irish princess Isolde. Since it first appeared in the 12th century, this popular tale has had a substantial impact on Western art and literature to include the romance of Lancelot and Guinevere in King Arthur and the Knights of the Round Table in the land of Camelot. Here, the tragic beauty of these tales is depicted in Knitting Fever's new yarns, Tristan and Isolde.

Instructions

Note: In this pattern, Isolde will be used in two ways, both spread open as a flat tape and also “whole” or unraveled as a bulky yarn. When using tape spread open, always insert needle from front to back into tiny holes along top edge of tape.

Cast on 8 (12) sts with yarn spread open by inserting needle from front to back into tiny holes along top edge of tape.

Prep Row: Knit with yarn spread open.

Rows 1-4: Knit with yarn as is, not spread open.

Rows 5-6: Knit with yarn spread open.

Repeat Rows 1-6 until 48”(58”) or desired length.

Bind off loosely with yarn spread open. Weave in ends.

Finished Measurements

Approximately 3” x 50” (small),
5” x 60” (large.)
Small size shown.

Materials

1 skein (100g) (2 skeins for large size) of Knitting Fever's *Isolde* shade #7
2 needles size US 10/6 mm
