



# *tristan and isolde scribble lace shawlette*

*The legend of Tristan and Isolde takes place during the Middle Ages, when knighthood and the chivalric code prevailed. The tragic story is of the adulterous love between the Cornish knight Tristan and the Irish princess Isolde. Since it first appeared in the 12th century, this popular tale has had a substantial impact on Western art and literature to include the romance of Lancelot and Guinevere in King Arthur and the Knights of the Round Table in the land of Camelot. Here, the tragic beauty of these tales is depicted in Knitting Fever's new yarns, Tristan and Isolde.*

## **Note:**

When using Yarn A (Isolde), spread tape open and always insert needle from front to back into tiny holes along top edge of tape. When switching between yarns A & B, carry yarn not in use along the side of knitted piece, OR alternatively, cut yarn A each time and weave in ends while still carrying yarn B along side.

**Finished Measurements**  
approximately 20 in x 48 in

## **Materials**

2 skeins (200g) of Knitting  
Fever's *Tristan* shade #7 (B)  
1 skein (100g) of Knitting  
Fever's *Isolde* shade #7 (A)  
2 needles size US 4/3.5 mm  
2 needles size US 15/10 mm

## **Gauge**

2 sts= 1 inch St st with Size 15  
needles.

## **Instructions**

Cast on 80 sts using size 4 needles and yarn A.

\*Knit 2 rows. Switch to size 15 needles and yarn B, knit 8 rows.

Repeat from \* 3X.

End by knitting 1 row using yarn A. Bind off using yarn A.

Weave in ends.
