#### Kuma scarf



#### YARN

Queensland Collection KUMA

#### MEASUREMENTS

Width approx 20 cm (8 in) Length approx 180 cm (70<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> in)

## Col. No.Quantity x 100g balls032

#### NEEDLES

1 pair 6.50mm needles (US 10.5)

#### TENSION/GAUGE

10.5 sts and 14 rows measured over 10 cm of Pattern using 6.50mm needles.

#### Pattern Repeat (3 sts)

Row 1 (RS) K2 \* yf, k3, with left hand needle lift 1st of the 3 sts just knitted over the last 2; rep from \* to last st, k1.
Row 2 Purl.
Row 3 K1 \* k3, with left hand needle lift 1st of the 3 sts just knitted over the last 2, yf; rep from \* to last 2 sts, k2.
Row 4 Purl.

These 4 rows form pattern repeat.

#### SCARF

Using 6.50mm needles, cast on 21 sts. Cont working in pattern repeat until length measures approx 180 cm ending on a row 8 of repeat. Cast off.

#### Fringe

Cut strands of yarn 20 cm in length. Using 4 strands tog, fold in half. Insert a crochet hook just above cast on (or off) edge from back to front. Catch the folded strands if yarn with the hook and pull through the knitting. Insert the ends of yarn into the loop and pull through to tighten. Cont in this way until edge is sufficiently covered with fringe. Rep along other edge.

#### MEASUREMENTS

One size to fit average head **Circumference** approx 50 cm (19<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> in)

**Col. No. Quantity x 100g balls** 03 1

NEEDLES 1 pair 5.50mm needles (US 9)

#### TENSION/GAUGE

14 sts and 26 rows measured over 10 cm of Garter st using 5.50mm needles.

#### HAT

Using 5.50mm needles, cast on 70 sts.

Cont working in Garter st (k all rows, first row worked is WS) until length measures 15 cm, ending on a WS row.

**Shape crown** (RS) K4 \* sl 1, k2tog, psso, k3; rep from \* to end. [48 sts]

Knit 5 rows.

Next row (RS)(dec) K2 \* sl 1, k2tog, psso, k1; rep from \* to last 2 sts, k2. [26 sts]

Knit 5 rows.

Next row (RS)(dec) K2 \* sl 1, k2tog, psso; rep from \* to end. [10 sts]

Cut yarn, leaving enough length to sew seam, thread through rem sts and pull to tighten.

Sew seam.

#### POMPOM

Cut two circles of cardboard, approx 6.5 cm in diameter (this will make a finished pompom of approx 4 cm). Mark and cut out a small circle (approx 1.5 cm in diameter) in the centre of the two pieces. Wind the yarn around the cardboard until the centre hole is almost filled up. Using a pair of scissors, place the point between the two circles of cardboard and cut around keeping the scissors in between all the time. Using a double strand of yarn, wrap around between the two circles of cardboard, knot firmly and take away the cardboard. Trim the pompom to size. Rep along other edge.
